Certificate of Recognition

The Freedom Chapter, Sons of the American Revolution, will provide a Certificate of Recognition to all Tall Timbers District and George Strake District Scouts achieving the rank of Eagle.

- The certificate may be presented at the Court of Honor by a local chapter member. If desired, the Scout may request the presentation be made by a chapter member in historic military uniform.
- If a chapter member is not available on the requested date, the certificate will be mailed to the troop for presentation.

Eagle Scout Scholarship Program

Guidelines for the **Eagle Scout Scholarship** Program are found on *the reverse side of this sheet*.

- The Freedom Chapter will award a \$250 scholarship to one Eagle Scout annually in either the Tall Timbers District or the George Strake District.
- The Freedom Chapter winner will be entered in the state competition for an additional scholarship amount.
- The state winner will be entered in the national competition for an additional scholarship amount.

Open to all Eagle Scouts in the **Tall Timbers** and the **George Strake Districts** who are currently registered in an active unit and are age 18 or under on December 31, 2011. The Eagle Scout award may have been earned prior to the year of application. College plans do not need to be completed in order to receive the cash scholarship.

The competition is conducted in three phases, local (Chapter), State (Society), and National. The competition begins at the local chapter level:

1. The local SAR Freedom Chapter will award one \$250 cash scholarship.
2. The chapter's winning entry will then be eligible to compete for a \$1,500 cash scholarship award given at the state level.
3. The winner of the Texas Society Contest is forwarded on to the National Society Contest. The national award winner will receive an \$8,000 scholarship award.

Entrants need to complete only one application – the one for the chapter competition. The local winner's application is then used for the state competition, and if it is a winner again, it is used for the national competition. The deadline for submission of the application is **December 1, 2010**.

The application consists of:

1. The two-page application form
2. The four-generation ancestor chart
3. The 500-word essay

You may apply more than one year if you meet the age requirements but no more than \$1,500 total may be granted to any one Eagle Scout by the Texas Society Eagle Scout Contest.
